1. RELIGIOUS FREEDOM AMENDMENT

HB 340 (Henry) [Final Passage] Prohibits government infringement of the right of every person to freely express his religious beliefs.

Status: Died in Conference Committee.

Yes = 72 (+) No = 25 (-) Not Voting = 7 (?)

2. HEALTHCARE WORKERS' CONSCIENCE ACT

HB 517 (LeBas) [Concurrence]
Protects healthcare workers from having to perform or participate in immoral acts or procedures.

Status: Signed by the Governor.

Yes = 88 (+) No = 12 (-) Not Voting = 4 (?)

3. "CHOOSE LIFE" PLATE FUND DISTRIBUTION

SB 289 (Appel) [Final Passage]
Distributes to qualified nonprofits revenues collected from "Choose Life" specialty license plates.

Status: Signed by the Governor.

Yes = 85 (+) No = 4 (-) Not Voting = 15 (?)

4. BIRTH CERTIFICATE CLARIFICATION

HB 60 (Perry) [Final Passage]
Clarifies that only married couples and individuals may legally adopt children in Louisiana.

Status: Died on the Senate Calendar.

Yes = 78 (+) No = 17 (-) Not Voting = 10 (?)

5. SUBSIDIZED ADVERTISING FOR CASINOS

HB 714 (Norton) [Final Passage]
Allows gambling entities to deduct the cost of "promotional expenses" from their revenue in order to reduce their tax payments.

Status: Defeated on House Floor.

Yes = 18 (-) No = 74 (+) Not Voting = 12 (?)

6. "MORE BARS IN MORE PLACES"

SB 136 (L. Jackson) [Final Passage] Allows a restaurant to operate as a bar or nightclub without requiring additional permits.

Status: Signed by the Governor

Yes = 69 (-) No = 30 (+) Not Voting = 5 (?)

7. STATE SOVEREIGNTY

SCR 2 (Crowe) [Final Consideration]
Affirms Louisiana's sovereignty under the Tenth Amendment of
the U.S. Constitution. Demands that federal government halt its practice
of assuming powers and imposing mandates upon the
states for unconstitutional purposes.

Status: Filed with the Secretary of State.

Yes = 65 (+) No = 12 (-) Not Voting = 27 (?)

8. DELAYS "STELLY TAX" REPEAL

HB 689 (Peterson) [Concurrence] Delays the "Stelly Tax" repeal by several years.

Status: Defeated in Conference Committee.

Yes = 34 (-) No = 69 (+) Not Voting = 1 (?)

9. ATHLETIC EQUAL ACCESS

HB 531 (Henry) [Final Passage] Allows home study students to participate in public school athletic programs.

Status: Died in Conference Committee.

Yes = 65 (+) No = 35 (-) Not Voting = 4 (?)
